Communion Invitation

We remember in this holy season that God sent his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to bring us salvation and eternal life. Confession

Heal our hearts and relationships. In your great mercy fill us with your Spirit that we might see our deep need of Jesus' saving power.

Prayer of Consecration

On the night on which he gave himself up for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, gave it to his disciples and said, "Take, eat. This is my body, broken for you." When the supper had ended, he took the cup, gave thanks, gave it to his disciples and said, "Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood, which seals God's promise, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins."

When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we experience anew the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ and look forward to that day foretold by prophets and apostles, when he comes in final victory. Father, send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine, that in this holy sharing we may know the presence of Jesus, who gave his body and blood for us all.
